A very good point Julie -- Tim had us write the following explanation for him:

We would like to purchase self-care products, such as face masks and friendship bracelet materials, to share with other wxmen during our *Slumber Party* event. These objects will be used to help us heal from a summer of labor, and help us prepare to do more work in the coming years, decades, and centuries.

This language comes from a practice of resistance dedicated to prioritizing the health of women, people of color, and QT*folks over white men (as seen [here](#)); in that tradition, we are hosting this afternoon of rejuvenation where womxn who are expected to carry systemic burdens are instead expected (and funded!) to take care of themselves. (While simultaneously redirecting that money from the pockets of the white men that have long expected to be taken care of).

What do you all think? Is it okay to show this to Procurement/Accounting?
